TOURISM

A tourist visa allows foreign nationals who intend to travel for tourism purposes to enter Italy and other Schengen Area countries for a short period of time.

In the case of an invitation from an Italian citizen or a foreign national legally residing in Italy, a “declaration of invitation” must be presented, in which the inviter certifies their willingness to provide hospitality in Italy to the visa applicant.

For minors or students traveling with their parents: a certificate of school enrollment, a birth certificate, and, if applicable, authorization from the other parent.

For minors or students traveling with third parties: a certificate of school enrollment, a birth certificate, authorization from the parents or their legal guardians, and documentation proving the parents’ financial resources.

To apply for a visa, you must submit:

- 1) A duly completed and signed residence visa application form;
- 2) A passport valid for at least three months beyond the duration of the stay. For third-country nationals, the original and a copy of the document proving the applicant’s residence status (valid residence permit or long-stay visa).
- 3) A recent ICAO-format photo;
- 4) Documentation proving the availability of adequate financial means to support oneself in Italy (Table from the Ministry of the Interior Directive dated March 1, 2000);
- 5) Flight reservation;
- 6) Proof of accommodation (hotel reservation, declaration of hospitality, etc.);
- 7) invitation letter or hotel reservation, if necessary;
- 8) health insurance providing a minimum coverage of €30,000 for medical expenses, emergency hospitalization, and repatriation costs;
- 9) documentation proving your employment status;
- 10) Bank statements for the last 3 months;
- 11) Receipt for payment of consular fees, in accordance with the procedures established by the Italian diplomatic-consular mission with jurisdiction over the territory;
- 12) Copy of the national internal passport (page with personal information and page with the residence stamp).
